pecial Kids Special Families (SKSF) is a non-profit 501 (c)3 umbrella organization with several unique programs designed to support people with disabilities of all ages from early childhood through adult as well as their families and caregivers. In 1999, Zach's Place at the Laurie Hillyard Family Center opened a

respite and childcare facility serving children with disabilities and special needs ages 2.5 through 21 years old. Since that time, SKSF has expanded its reach filling the growing needs of the community. In 2001, a therapeutic foster care program was launched specializing in foster care and adoption for youth with disabilities and special needs. In 2005, SKSF added programs for adults with disabilities and host home services (adult foster care). On a given day, over 180 individuals participate in SKSF programs.

Respite care is the common theme among all three SKSF programs. Did you know that respite care is the most frequently requested service by families having a loved one with a disability, but is one of the least funded services? Caregivers of those with disabilities provide better, safer care when they are able to recharge with regular breaks. Not only are caregivers given a much needed break, but they can rest

easy knowing their loved-one is in professional, trained and caring hands. SKSF help families remain strong and healthy. No family has ever been turned away because of inability to pay, so many programs run on a deficit.
