



## FUNCTION

To participate in presenting disability awareness education puppet shows to children in preschools, kindergarten and grades 1-4, daycare centers, youth groups, and other community opportunities. May occasionally participate in evening or weekend programs for community or fundraising events.

## DUTIES

Attend a puppet orientation session about disabilities and puppetry. Learn and practice puppetry skills and one or more roles in the puppet show. Present puppet shows, which may include any or all of the following:

- Transporting the puppets and equipment
- Helping to set up equipment
- Performing a part to accurately convey the show's message
- Interacting appropriately with children in audience for questions and answers
- Packing up puppets and equipment
- Interacting with other puppeteers and SKSF staff
- Distributing and collecting teacher evaluation materials

## COMMITMENT

- Two or more days per month during school year for shows
- Memorize scripts within mutually agreed upon period of time
- Rehearsals as needed
- Ongoing communication with coordinator for monthly availability

## QUALIFICATIONS

- Able to relate well to young children
- Able to memorize a script, project voice with expression and character
- Have own transportation
- Experienced with or willing to learn about disabilities
- Able to lift and carry puppets and props
- Min. age requirement: High School age

- Develop skills and learn about disabilities and SKSF programs
- Gain experience or reference for career planning
- Make new friends and participate in activities & recognition events
